Peter J. Corcoran, Special Agent for the United States Postal Service, Office of Inspector General, addressed the club on February 24th. A former Navy man, Peter has been on this job since 2004. Supplementing his remarks with a PowerPoint presentation and video, Corcoran discussed the role of the Inspector General and how this relatively new position has grown. When he started, there were two inspectors serving New England and now there are over six hundred. The Inspector General is responsible for investigating internal issues in the postal service, specifically audits and workmen's compensation cases along with fraud, theft and misconduct.
